**Course Description:** This course prepares emergency responder managers and community leaders to conduct a comprehensive, capabilities-based threat and risk assessment for a weapons of mass destruction (WMD)/terrorism/all-hazards incidents under the National Response Plan (NRP) and Presidential Directives. Participant activities focus on the jurisdictional process to determine ability to respond to chemical, biological, radiological, nuclear, and explosive (CBRNE)/all hazard events and the development of the needs assessment to fill gaps identified within the solution areas. The assessment incorporates the State Homeland Security and Strategy (SHSAS) processes. The course delivery combines lecture, small group discussions, participant activities, and multimedia scenarios to improve the multidisciplinary emergency team's capability to prevent, react to, or recover from CBRNE/all-hazard, mass casualty events.

**Target Audience:** Law Enforcement, Fire Service, Emergency Medical Services, Hazardous Materials, Public Health, Health Care, Public Works, Emergency Management, Personnel required to conduct vulnerability assessments of jurisdiction-selected sites, Private Sector and military (if invited by host jurisdiction).

**Prerequisite:** Participants should work in one of the preceding disciplines/services, possess a working knowledge of the jurisdiction's or hospital's Emergency Operations Plan and complete a CBRNE/terrorism incident awareness course such as AWR160. TEEX, in cooperation with DHS, distributes a WMD/Terrorism Awareness for Emergency Responders course via the Internet at <http://www.teexwmdcampus.com>.
