Class Title: MGT433 Isolation and Quarantine for Rural Communities (DHS Approved) (Post Approved)

Class Date: March, 10, 2016

Sponsor(s): Missouri State Emergency Management Agency, The Rural Domestic Preparedness Consortium (RDPC), and the Harrison County Emergency Management Agency

Course Description: This 4.5 hour, instructor-led course delivers the general knowledge necessary to begin planning for situations requiring the isolation and/or quarantine (I&Q) of a large portion of a local, rural population. The course explores I&Q in a modern context, discusses legal and ethical issues associated with I&Q, and presents preparedness, planning, response, and support considerations. In addition, Isolation and Quarantine for Rural Communities discusses communication strategies as well as I&Q resources. Intended for a blended audience consisting of representatives from public health, public safety, the private sector, and elected offices, this course also provides an opportunity for cross-sector communication and learning. This delivery method, in turn, can kick-start the planning process.

Target Audience: Emergency Management Agency, Emergency Medical Services, Fire Service, Governmental Administrative, Law Enforcement, Health Care, Public Health
